Angela Yahaira Breining became a Board Member in June 2022. Angela is a labor associate with the law firm Beeson, Tayer & Bodine where she represents labor unions and individual employees along the greater Sacramento Valley. Angela's passion in serving workers, immigrants, and Spanish-speaking individuals stems from her experience as an immigrant from Sinaloa, Mexico.

As soon as Angela got into college she was ignited to fight for social justice. Angela became a Community Worker at California Rural Legal Assistance, Inc., in 2012 where she provided community outreach and legal education to farm workers and other rural low-wage individuals in the Yuba-Sutter region. Angela doubled-majored in Latin American Studies and Political Science at CSU Chico and soon thereafter attended law school at UC Davis School of Law. Angela entered law school with the intention of returning to her community to continue fighting for the rights of immigrant and low-wage workers. While in law school Angela was a student advocate in the Workers' Rights Clinic at the Center for Workers' Rights as well as in the Immigration Law Clinic at UC Davis School of Law. Upon graduation Angela was a Skadden Law Fellow in the Worker's Rights Program at Centro Legal de la Raza. As a Skadden Fellow Angela created a project to expand legal services to immigrant workers in counties North of Sacramento.

Angela continues to use her legal expertise to support the Latinx community and is honored to be a part of LLC, an organization committed to the wellbeing of the community.
